Facing Death, as Resurrection People

Pastor's

Message

On Sunday, April 16, most Christians around the world will celebrate Easter. Great anthems and hymns will be sung. The good

news of resurrection will be preached. Joy and gladness will rule the day.

On Monday, April 17, life will return to its usual routine. Commuters on their way to work will find the traffic snarled and tempers may flare. Somewhere along the way a machine may fail, a person may make a mistake, a tragedy will occur, and someone on the way to work will die. In that moment, Easter may be forgotten all together.

While Easter's message is joyfully received, it can be so easily lost in the humdrum of our daily lives. Resurrection overcomes death, yet death is not to be denied. All of us, like Jesus, face the power of death sooner or later. How do we, as Resurrection People, deal with the powers of death still at work in our world?

In many ways, death is a natural part of life. Jesus speaks to this in many of His parables. Seeds die as they give birth to the plant. Fruits die to give birth to the seeds they carry. Life and death are always dancing together. Resurrection is not about denying the reality of the dance. Resurrection is about living free from the power of fear that often accompanies death. Fear is the great barrier that can alienate us, enslave us, and deform us. When we live in fear of death, we lose the power to live life to its fullest. The empty tomb proclaims God's love. It reveals that those who die under the umbrella of God's love have nothing to fear. Resurrection allows us to live boldly and love with reckless abandon, trusting that God's love equips us to face every challenge.

If we are to truly live as Resurrection People, we need to

face death differently—not with fear, but in confidence. Yes, we will all die, but death is not the end of life. It is merely another transformation wherein the energy of life is passed along to give life to the future. If we can embrace that reality, we are empowered for discipleship, for living as reflections of Christ in our own time and place.

As you move forward from Easter, I invite you to consider some changes that can allow the power of resurrection to live in you on a daily basis. (1.) Let go of your fears and trust that God knows your needs and will provide for you. The time you spend in anger or in worry is better spent on creative thinking that can help you face the cause of your fear. (2.) When faced with challenges that seem beyond your ability, set them aside and reach out to help someone else with his or her challenges. When we help others, we often discover hidden resources within ourselves that not only help others, but help us as well. (3.) Resolve to live from gratitude rather than from dissatisfaction. Be thankful for your problems—they will teach you more than any success. Then be thankful toward God for all that you have been given and all that you have been denied. (4.) Be forgiving of yourself and of others. Holding on to past wrongs and dwelling on failures prevent you from looking forward. Give up name-calling and judgment because they are demeaning. Choose, instead, to be gracious—even towards those who may have wronged you. Forgiveness transforms the wronged even more than the wrongdoer.

If you can master even one of these suggestions in the coming year, you will truly be a Resurrection Person, empowered for vibrant and vital living.

We are still in need of a large can opener. We are still


looking and checking into one.
