Pastor's Message Re-Creation—Jesus' Style

Are you enjoying your summer? Have you had the opportunity to golf, fish, hike, bike, travel, camp, run, walk, swim, or just relax? Summer's weather affords us many possibilities to enjoy our favorite recreational activities. We can get out into nature to enjoy exhilarating pursuits. We can travel to new places or visit old friends. Summer has long been a season of recreation for folks in industrialized societies.

Recreation is simply the word, "re-creation" said quickly. Our summer activities offer us the chance to be "re-created" by engaging in actions that fulfill our dreams or stimulate our bodies and minds in new ways. Even a bad day of fishing can be better than a good day at the office or factory.

As we engage in our favorite summer activities, I want to invite you to consider another form of recreation. I invite you to consider "re-creation—Jesus' style". As we read the scriptures, we often encounter Jesus at a time when the business of living has worn Him down. Like us, He is sometimes tired and seeks rest and renewal. As with our own lives, Jesus sometimes had difficulty getting away for a time of refreshment. There were always persons who needed Him. They wanted healing. They hungered for hope. They sought words of encouragement. Jesus always had compassion for those who sought Him out. Even when He was tired, He found the personal energies to meet another's need, to touch another's hurt, to lift another from despair. As He did so, something miraculous happened. Lives were changed—the life of the one seeking help and the life of the Savior Who offered it. Jesus was renewed by His love and compassion for others. When He set aside self-interest, God's Spirit welled up within Him, and He was fulfilled.

This experience of renewal is not something that God offered only to Jesus. It is offered to each and every one of us. When we put another's needs ahead of our own, God's Spirit

- Shed plans are available and look great. The construction of the new shed will start soon. It will be 16' x 12' with a loft, roll up door, and side entrance door. We are able to use the existing concrete slab. The building permit will cost \$25. Gary will take care of getting this. This new shed is being paid for through the Schmidt Family Memorial Fund. The remaining portion of the memorial fund will be allocated to the building fund. The existing shed is for sale and will be advertised during the rummage sale.

<u>New Business</u>:

- There was a crack in a maple tree, on the side of church, that was cut down.
- Bob and Gary attended a conference meeting in Green Lake, Wisconsin; they met with a few pastors and discussed shared ministry that are sharing with two UCC and one Presbyterian Church, but they are within miles from each other.
- We need to look at our mission statement.
- The front door of the church broke last week and will be fixed this week Thursday, June 15.
- We are collecting Best Choice Brand labels through a

program that exchanges labels for money. This brand is sold by Sal's Grocery and Don's Quality Market, and other retailers. We plan to collect and have boxes available at the entrances.

On Sunday, July 23, we marked "Christmas in July". We sang carols, reflected on the meaning of Christmas, and celebrated our Lord's birth. This special Sunday was held to remind us that Christ can be born in any moment of any season and to kick-off a special campaign to help eliminate our mortgage balance, so that we can begin 2018 debt free!

About fifteen years ago, we embarked on a mission to expand and improve our facilities. Ideas were considered, plans were made, and costs were estimated for an addition on the west side of the church. The addition we made to the building provided a much-needed elevator and classrooms for Sunday School and other gatherings. We also gained office space and a carport for entry during rainy weather. To accomplish these things, we took out a loan, and we have been paying back that loan for about fourteen years. Now, the end is in sight!

Now, we owe only about \$25,000.00 on that original mortgage of \$375.600. We would like to retire the mortgage before the beginning of the New Year. Moving into our next chapter of Settled Ministry without any debt will give us more options, as we consider the shape and size of that ministry. Hence, "Christmas in July".

Through this program, we plan to celebrate Christmas each month—on the Sunday closest to the 25th. (August 27th, September 24th, October 22nd, and November 26th). Each of these Sundays will feature something related to Christmas—like sharing Christmas Cookie recipes, or caroling at the homes of our shut-ins. On each of these Sundays, we invite our members and friends to bring a special monetary Christmas gift to the church that will help pay down the mortgage. If we can raise an <u>additional</u> \$5,000.00 each month, the mortgage will be paid off by Christmas!
