## Could You Be a Saint?

By the time you read this article, another Halloween with have come and gone. The candy will lie around the house for a while, but soon it will be replaced by candy canes. The costumes will be put away, and the broken pumpkins and toilet paper pranks will be cleaned up for another year.

Most of us think of Halloween as a time for dress up and imagination and we enjoy the opportunity to be playful as we think about scaring others. Halloween takes place on October 31<sup>st</sup>—All Hallows Eve—because November 1<sup>st</sup> is All Saints Day. October ends with thoughts of monsters and villains, but November begins with thoughts of saints—and not the ones in New Orleans.

So how does one become a saint? Do we dress up in white robes with wings on our backs and haloes on our heads? I don't think so. Being a saint is not about a costume or about outward appearance. Sainthood is a state of mind, a presence that we bring to life.

Yet, I am convinced that sainthood does have outward manifestations, things that can be seen by others. In the Roman tradition, a person must have performed three miracles to become a saint. If we were a Roman Catholic congregation, all of our members would already be onethird of the way there. It is truly a miracle that you allow me to be your interim pastor. You must be saints!!

On a serious note, what is a miracle? I think it is when God's reality of love and grace breaks into our world in some unexpected way. I think that miracles happen when regular folks lend themselves to God; becoming conduits of God's grace and love; pipelines of compassion and hope. That is something that all of us can aspire to—that all of us can do. When we lend ourselves to God, our lives can be used by God to perform miracles.

I am convinced that we lend ourselves to God when we become grateful and generous. Bringing a spirit of gratitude to our lives is the first step toward generosity. When we are grateful, we come to see that we have many gifts to share. Whether we are giving our money, our time, or our talents makes no difference. Any gift of self, however

small it may seem, has the potential to bring God's love to life; to allow God's grace to break through—and that is when miracles happen.

Our ability to give is directly related to our ability to put others first, to be other-directed rather than selfcentered. Folks like Francis of Assisi, Albert Schweitzer, Mother Theresa, and Martin Luther King, Jr., all embodied this capacity. They were saints in their living, and they touched many lives in the process. Martin Luther King, Jr. and Albert Schweitzer will never be named as saints by the Roman Church, but their impact on the world was still miraculous.

To be canonized is merely a complicated way of noting that someone was an example, a very good example of Christian faith and living. That is something all of us can do. Each human being has the capacity to convey God's love to others, to bring it to bear on a particular situation or circumstance.

Another element in sainthood is involvement. One may live a pious life by isolating themselves from others, but no one can become a saint until they interact with others. Miracles happen within the context of relationships and community. One person living alone on a desert island can perform no miracles, since there is no one else to be in relationship with—there is no community where God's love can be shared.

If you aspire to be a saint, you need to get involved in a cause, a movement, or an idea, which brings others together for a common purpose. You need to get involved in

church. Maybe you can assist with Sunday School; sing in the choir; lead worship; join a committee; attend a Bible Study; go on a mission trip; take on a service project with others; mentor a confirmand; come to a New Members' class to meet those who may join us; attend worship; serve a meal, serve on the Council; help with the newsletter; join a fellowship group; or get involved in any one of the other things we do at St. John's UCC. In such settings, you can become a pipeline of God's love and grace, and you may even perform a miracle or two.


