Pastor's Message... Lenting and Lending, Acts of Ministry...

On February 18, the Christian Church will mark Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. Lent is a period of 40 days, not including Sundays, that commemorates the forty days that Jesus spent in the wilderness in preparation for His ministry. Jesus went there to wrestle with His doubt and fear, so that He could do God's work with confidence and courage.

Like Jesus, we are also called to ministry, and we also need to prepare. Lent provides us with time to delve into the scriptures; to wrestle with our doubts and fears; and hopefully discover inner spiritual strength in the process. Then we use those new, or rediscovered, strengths to do the work of Christ among us.

Lent has traditionally been a time for self-sacrifice. Many of us may remember having to "give up something for Lent". I remember by parents insisting that my sister and I had to give up something. I also remember that they never agreed with my first choice, which was to give up doing my school homework. That—they insisted, was not a sacrifice! As a child, our Sunday School would often give us a dime folder with places for forty dimes. The idea was that each child would give a dime each day from his/her allowance as a sacrifice for Lent. In those days, that dime could buy two Hostess Twinkies or Cupcakes, or two candy bars, and when one is only eight or nine years old, that can seem like an awful lot to give. As I grew older, forces of inflation took their toll and those dime folders became quarter folders, but the intent was the same—make a daily sacrifice for others in the Spirit of Christ. When Jesus first went to the wilderness, He did so to test Himself, to determine if He was truly ready to lend Himself to God, to give Himself to all that God intended to do through Him. As we go through the Lenten season, we must also decide if we are truly ready to lend ourselves to God's purposes.

Lending is risky business—that is why banks charge interest when they lend us money. If we are a good risk, we get a lower interest rate. If we are a bad risk, we pay more. That is because the bank wants to lend, but they do not want to lose their money. They want to lend without cost. When God asks us to lend ourselves to the ministry of Jesus, we often act like bankers. We want to know what is in it for us—what gain we will experience. We want to focus on the spiritual interest that we will be paid. That is **not** how God works, however. Expecting reward or gain is an act of self-interest, not self-sacrifice. Just as Jesus gave Himself to God's purposes without concern for the cost—even the cost of His life, we are also called to lend ourselves selflessly to God's purpose.

While Lenting encourages us to be lending ourselves to God, the practices of Lent are not just about "giving up" something. They are also about "taking on" something. Lent challenges us to give up selfishness, but it also challenges us to take on a new spirit of love and grace. Love and grace are

Love and grace give us the courage we need to confront injustice and those in power, who sow the seeds of injustice.
