Pastor's Message...

What's It Worth?

How many times in our lives do we ask that question? In the grocery store, we pick up items, look at the price, and then determine if the item is worth it. At the auto dealer, we pick out a model, then ask for a price and do the same thing. Sometimes the price is set by the seller, as in the grocery store and at the auto dealer. At other times, the price is set by the buyers, as in an auction. There are times that we can negotiate a different price and times when we cannot. No matter what the system, no matter where we are shopping, we ask ourselves "What is it worth?" thousands of times in our lifetime.

The worth of things can be a fickle matter. There are times in life when we learn that something we have purchased has increased in value—its worth has gone up. At such times we often feel a sense of pride in our shopping skills. At other times, we find that what we have paid for has lost significant value, and we may rue that fact for some time. The trouble is that when we decide to buy something,

challenged to wrestle with questions of worth. What is life

worth? What was Christ's life worth? What is my life worth? Is the Christian lifestyle worth it? The questions abound, and the answers we find will have life-long implications.

We humans are always wrestling with matters of self-worth. Sometimes we value our lives; sometimes we do not. We also wrestle with matters of worth in others. We value those whom we love, those with whom we share common interests, those who see life the same way we do. We tend to de-value those whom we do not love, those with whom

we disagree, those who live lifestyles that challenge or confront us. But who really sets the worth of another? Who determines if one life is valuable—worth risking everything? Who determines when a life has no value?

While we may think that we set the value—much like an auction, there is only One Who sets the value of a human life—the One Who created it. Just as the manufacturer sets the price of the product made, so our Creator God sets the price of each human life. This Lenten season is a reminder to all of us that God sets the price of each life very high—high on Calvary's cross. God sets our value on a par with God's own value—for Jesus is God Incarnate, come to pay the price

for us all—because God loves us that much. God spent God's all to restore our value and to save us from ourselves and our penchant to devalue ourselves and others.

What is even more astounding, God sets the price for each human life at the same level. There is never a glut in the market place that lowers our value. There is never scarcity that makes one of us more valuable than another. Each of us is always worth everything to God—and that is the great good news of Easter!!

Our problem is that we have trouble understanding God's value system. We continue to do things that diminish the value of others, and sometimes we even diminish the value of ourselves. We find things wrong. We give greater value to youth and beauty than we do to old and ugly. We value athletes more than nerds—except when our computer has a problem. We value the famous more than the unknown. We can find countless things that we think affect the value of a person, and we tend to apply those things with total disregard to the value system put in place by our Creator.

As we journey towards the cross this Lenten season, all of us would do well to remember its real meaning. The cross reminds us of how much God loves us, how much God values each and every one of us. Your life, my life, the life of everyone who has ever been born or ever will be born is like that pearl of great value that Jesus spoke about. God values us so much, that God chooses to die—setting our worth once and for all. We are all valued children of God—each of us worth the life of Christ—no more and no less.
