#### *Confirmation Revisited A Four-Week Refresher Course for Adult Christians*

When were you confirmed – 5 years ago, 10 years ago, 20 or more years ago? Do you remember what you learned back then? Chances are you may have forgotten *just a little* of what you learned back then. Do you have a young person heading for confirmation in the next year or two? Would you like to be prepared for what they will need to learn?

Last month, we confirmed three young men into our fellowship. To be confirmed, they participated in two years of study and reflection. This month, you have a chance to do what they did—in only four weeks.

**Confirmation Revisited** will take place on the four Thursday nights of June. It will begin with a light meal at 6:00 p.m. and an hour of study and reflection will follow. For those who do not want a meal, you can arrive at 6:30 p.m.

Come; join us for fellowship, study, and dialogue as we seek to grow in our faith and service.

#### Pastor's Message... "Come Ye Thankful People, Come ...."

Do you recognize those old familiar words? They come from a hymn of the church, one that we have been singing for over one hundred and fifty years. We usually sing these words in November, and



associate them with Thanksgiving. It is, after all, a harvest song, and Thanksgiving is a harvest festival.

While we associate thanksgiving with the fall because of our climate, there are places in the world where harvests happen earlier in the year. In the Mediterranean climate, the first harvest takes place in May and June when the first grains and fruits of the season are gathered in.

Our Hebrew ancestors in the faith had their own harvest festival. It was called Pentecost, but it was also known as the *Festival of the First Fruits*. It was a celebration rooted in the Exodus experience. When God freed the people of Israel from slavery in Egypt, the key moment was the Passover, when the angel of death passed over the first-born of Israel. Because of this act of grace, Hebrews believed that "first things" belonged to God. So, during Pentecost the first of everything was brought to the temple and dedicated to God. Many of these donated goods were then made available to the less fortunate — a kind of ancient food pantry. Others were sold to raise funds needed for the temple.

As we Christians know, Pentecost has a different meaning for us. We celebrate it as the day that the Holy Spirit came to the disciples and empowered them to carry... Page 3 Pastor's article continues on page 5

... on what Jesus had begun. For this reason, we often call Pentecost "The Birth-day of the *Church*".

Last month, Christians around the world celebrated Pentecost and reflected on what it means to be filled with the Spirit. The scriptures tell us that the Spirit enabled the disciples to tell about God's power and might to all people. They were able to speak in languages that they had not been taught, and they could communicate with people from all nations that had gathered in Jerusalem for the *Festival of the First Fruits*.

Whenever we hear and reflect on the story of Pentecost found in the *second* chapter of Acts, we tend to focus on the outward signs, on the wind, the tongues of fire, and the ability of the disciples to speak in languages they did not know. What we often miss is the story behind the story.

When the disciples gathered for the Hebrew holiday of Pentecost so long ago, *they* were a sad and dis-heartened group. Their leader and friend, Jesus, had been killed by the Roman authorities in collusion with their religious leaders. All of their hopes had been dashed, and they were filled with grief. In addition, they were also fearful—fearful that their religious leaders would come after them as well.

Even though they were filled with sadness, grief, doubt, and fear, they gathered to give thanks anyway. I am convinced that their thankful attitudes is what paved the way for the Holy Spirit to come *into* their hearts and transform their lives. I am further convinced that having a thankful heart is what allows the Spirit to do its work in each of us as well. When we are thankful, our heart is like an... During the month of June, St. John's will have *Strengthen the Church* (STCO) offering envelopes available in the East Entrance and the West Entrance. This is



... open door, through which the Holy Spirit enters. When we are resentful and lacking in gratitude, then our heart is like a locked door, and the Spirit cannot gain entry into our heart.

I am convinced that the Spirit needs grateful partners, now more than ever. Our world is increasingly fragmented by jealousy, envy, hatred, prejudice and bigotry. All



these lead to more and more outbreaks of violence. Whether it is a school shooting, the use of chemical weapons in Syria, the rise of white supremacy and fascism around the world, racial injustices in Starbucks, or lies and name-calling that flow copiously from the White House—all around us we see the damage inflicted when hearts are closed to gratitude. In frustration, many wring their hands and wonder aloud, *why God allows such things to happen*.

The truth is that God can do nothing until we open our hearts to gratitude. God calls us to be partners, but does not force us. God wants us to be grateful partners, but will not bail us out when our selfishness leads to pain, suffering, and death. Saving us from such consequences would only serve to enable our bad behaviors and irresponsible actions.

God is willing to help us, however! When we open our hearts to gratitude, God unleashes the transforming power of the Holy Spirit, and we and our world are changed for the better.

### Women's Guild Minutes



The Women's Guild met on Wednesday, May 2, 2018, at 1:30 p.m., with ten members present.

Our devotional leader was Marian Zuleger, who shared several well known hymns from a special hymn book, Just As I Am was written by a lady who was bedridden and started to write verses that became a lifelong work for her. She started when she was forty-eight-years old and lived to be eighty-two-years old. One never knows what lies ahead for one's life and what God might provide. Another hymn, Sweet By and By, was put into words and melody by two chatting friends—a song sung at funerals. A hymn sung often is God Will Take Care of You-of a husband whose wife was very sick and started writing the words, and he put it to melody! They sung it together at their training school. It was published in 1905. Another hymn–I'll Be There–was put into words by Mr. Black and published with music in 1894. *America the Beautiful* is a familiar patriotic song that bonded people together as a national hymn, published in 1912.

Marian also shared a beautiful poem and some great jokes. The offering was taken, and our devotional time closed with the *Lord's Prayer* prayed in unison.

The business-meeting portion of our meeting was called to order by President Roberta Lorenz. The secretary's and treasurer's reports were read and approved. The balance in the general fund is \$5,003.60 and \$472.98 in the memorial fund.

### Thank You!

Ron and I cannot say it enough, "Thank you!" Each of you

praying for Ron and me is a gift beyond our ability to express your preciousness in our hearts, lives and sight. The Lord is our strength, and in Him we do find rest—and it is by faith and your prayers



that we are comforted by the Lord Jesus. We certainly are not the only ones who are living in tough circumstances—some of you are in battles of your own. We pray that the Lord God Almighty blesses you a hundred-fold for your prayers, kindness, generosity, and support and that He continues to provide all you need.

The latest update: Ron is able to be home on his own for a few hours at a time—the doctor said, as long as I am within minutes of being able to respond to a call for help. We live only about seven minutes from St. John's—Thanks Be to God! Ron had an appointment with the specialist at Froedtert Hospital on May 24. They are glad (as we all are) that he has been out of the hospital for almost three weeks straight! That is no small feat for him. He is weak, but not as weak as he was even two weeks ago-Praise God! He still has much to overcome and heal from—he has five medical appointments the week of May 27, but he is graduating from the visiting nurse on the 31st (as long as he continues to progress)! His doctors would like him to have cardiopulmonary physical therapy, but he has not yet been accepted for that. Please pray he will be accepted and that it will help him heal. He is now able to walk about 1/3 of a mile (*that is far compared* with how few feet he could walk in the beginning of May)! He still



get nauseated much of the time—and takes two medications to control that. Please pray the nausea gone and his multiple fractured ribs heal so his pain can decrease.

Thank you for your continued care and prayers. THANKYOU for each and every part you have in Ron's story—we know we could not have come this far without the Lord or without you.

Many of the hymns we sing were written long ago by persons we can only read about in history books. This month's Hymn of the Month is a polar opposite. "Like a Tree Beside the

Waters" was written by the Rev. James Martin in 1993, to celebrate the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Campbellsport United Church of Christ, here in Wisconsin. The tune, *Silver Creek*, was composed by Roy Hopp, in 1989.

Because of its more modern birth, this hymn's language and theology are more in tune with our current beliefs, so there is no need to "adapt" the wording or explain views of God that are no longer held by those who sing its verses.
