Hymn of the Month: *“Come, Holy Spirit, Heavenly Dove”*



During the month of May, we will sing this famous hymn written by Isaac Watts, to the tune, ST. AGNES, composed by John B. Dykes.

Dykes' tune was first published in 1866. He named the tune for Agnes, a Christian martyr who was killed for refusing to marry a nobleman. Agnes insisted that she was engaged to Christ and would not take a husband. This famous tune has been used for several hymns, the most notable being “Jesus, the Very Thought of Thee”.

Watts was the son of a schoolmaster, who was a nonconformist and was imprisoned on at least two occasions for his religious beliefs. Watts went on to become a minister and was a prolific writer, penning many poems, hymns and sermons.

This hymn reminds us that we need the presence of the Holy Spirit to kindle our faith, strengthen our resolve, and open us to the love of our Savior!



Pastor's Message...

Learning and Practicing the Three Gs...

Back when I was a child, public education was often explained as teaching the three Rs: Readin', Ritin', and 'Rithmetic. It did not seem to matter that two of the three words used were not even words. The alliteration seemed more important than proper spelling or pronunciation, and it fit the old song: *"readin', and ritin', and rithmetic, taught at the end of a hickory stick"*. The phrase with its silly wording conveyed the importance of the basics of education: words and numbers.

As I think about all I have learned about Christian faith since my childhood years, I find myself thinking more and more about the three Gs that embody what Christian faith is all about. **Grace, Gratitude, and Generosity** are at the heart of all that we believe and all that we do. I write this newsletter article knowing that my time among us is drawing to a close, and in the months ahead, a new chapter of Settled Ministry will soon unfold. As you prepare for that transition, I invite you to reflect on the importance of these three Gs.

Grace: The apostle Paul placed great emphasis on grace, reminding early Christians that it was the foundation of our faith—**"all are saved by grace, which comes as a gift from God, through Jesus Christ"** (Romans 5:15). As we seek to live out our faith, **grace** is often the most challenging of ideas. While it may be easy to accept **grace**, to rejoice in the fact that God sees beyond our sin and is always willing to forgive, it is not always easy for us to forgive others. Jesus reminds us of this sad reality when He tells the parable of

the ungrateful slave in Matthew 18:23-34. In that parable, a certain slave owes his master ten thousand talents (an amount equal to about ten million dollars today). The slave cannot repay the debt and begs for mercy. The master forgives the debt and the slave rejoices. Later, that same slave tries to collect on a debt owed to him by a fellow slave, who owes him one hundred denarii (an amount equal to about \$15,000 in today's world). When his fellow slave asks for relief, the ungrateful slave demands payment and has his fellow slave imprisoned until the debt is paid. When the master learns of this injustice, he then rescinds his order of forgiveness and holds the unforgiving servant accountable. Clearly, Jesus understood our struggles with forgiving, and His parable reminds us that **God's grace** comes with an obligation—we, too, must forgive. **Grace** is necessary for any ministry to thrive.

Once we realize the real meaning of **God's grace**, once our lives are touched by its power, it leads us to **Gratitude**. The hymn, "Amazing Grace" is perhaps the best-known song of **gratitude** ever written. It speaks to the transforming power of **grace** and how that power leads to a **gratitude** that changes everything. The **gratitude** that flows from **God's grace** is not just an expression of thanks offered when life is good and blessings flow. **Grace-inspired Gratitude** is a lifestyle. It is lived in every moment—even when the moments are filled with challenge, pain, or suffering. Anyone can be grateful when all is well. Only faithful, grace-full persons can be grateful in the face of

adversity. The **Gratitude** to which we are called as Christians is not some Pollyanna way of looking at the world that prevents us from seeing all its faults. Rather this **gratitude** is a matter of ultimate trust in God. We trust in God's love in all seasons, and as Paul reminds us in his letter to the Romans, "we know that God works for good" in all things. **Grace-inspired Gratitude** sees the potential of transformation in every moment—especially in those that are painful and challenging. When that thought is the foundation of all that we are and all that we do, **gratitude** can fill every fiber of our being, and lead us to the third G, the "soft" G—**Generosity**.

Generosity is the ultimate expression of faith, the outcome of **Grace** and **Gratitude**. It is the ultimate intention of God that all human beings become **generous**. I am convinced that God has chosen humankind as partners in the Divine Enterprise because only humankind has the potential to become **generous**. We humans are not born **generous**, but we have the potential to become **generous**. As children, we can be selfish and self-centered, but as immaturity gives way to maturity, we learn the value of sharing and helping, and the seeds of **generosity** are planted in the human heart. Whether those seeds ever sprout and reach maturity depends on how we process **God's Grace** and learn to live from **Gratitude**.

Ron and I are so tremendously blessed by you! Your prayers sustain us in Christ. The journey to wellness has proven to be extremely laden with complications for Ron. As most of you are aware (thank you, Pastor, for keeping this wonderful congregation of friends informed), Ron was in the ER three different times the week of April 22, 2018, with further complications. He did not receive the appropriate care until Friday's appointment with his primary care provider—then a trip to the ER at her direction. Ron suffered a small pneumothorax that was apparent on the images, which were taken on Sunday the 22nd, but the doctor neglected to inform us and neglected to treat him. (A pneumothorax is a collapsed lung.) Ron's right lung has repeatedly collapsed since January 31, but Sunday (April 22) it was only a small portion of his lung that had collapsed, so the doctor didn't think it was anything to report to us (although the radiologist felt it significant enough to include in the radiology reports).

When Ron's condition worsened, we returned to the ER Tuesday night into Wednesday morning (24-25), where the doctor diagnosed pneumonia in Ron's right lung. He was given antibiotics in an IV and sent home with a prescription. Unfortunately, Ron's condition deteriorated, and by Friday morning, he needed more care than is possible at home. His primary care provider sent us to the ER and recommended he be admitted. After all day in the ER, and insisting the PA admit him, Ron was admitted under the medical care of Dr. Marquis!

Dr. M was fantastic and thorough! Thanks be to God—Dr. Marquis was literally an answer to our prayers. Ron's pneumonia had worsened while on the Z-Pac, and Dr. M decided to give Ron a broad (stronger) antibiotic because of his exposure to so much (as he had been in and out of hospitals numerous times since his January 31 surgery). After three full days of IV antibiotics, IV steroids, and appropriate medical care, in AMC, Ron was discharged on Monday, April 30! He is improved! He is not fully back to good health, yet, but he is able to move around a lot better! (He literally struggled to walk from the ER bed to the ER room doorway on Friday, as it caused him to be breathless).

It has been an extremely difficult month for Ron (and those who

love him), but it is truly your prayers and your generosity that enables him to progress. Even though he has suffered major setbacks numerous times following his initial discharge on February 11, he is determined to press forward and get stronger and healthier each day! Please continue to hold him in your prayers—it only takes a virus or infection or hard cough to set him way-back; his cough (last week) caused a fractured rib below the two ribs that have three-inch pieces cut out from his January surgery. Ever since his initial surgery, Ron suffers from nausea (even with medication to fight the nausea) so it is very difficult for him to eat. Please pray God will heal whatever is causing the nausea. He needs an esophagram, but the pneumonia put that on hold. When he regains more strength and the steroids are out of his body, the doctors can proceed. I believe God can fix whatever is wrong before the test is even completed—will you pray He will do that please?



We truly thank God for you. One of my favorite chapters in the Book of Psalms is Chapter 27. In that chapter, verse 13 reads, “I would have lost heart, unless I had believed that I would see the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living” (NKJV). You, dear neighbors and friends, are examples of the “goodness of the Lord in the land of the living”! Oh how grateful we are that you are in our lives!

Thank you for your continued faith-filled prayers for complete healing, significantly diminished pain, for better days and nights for my dear husband, and no more complications!

May God richly reward you for all you do to the glory of the Lord!
