Pastor's Article

"Time like an ever-rolling stream, soon bears us all away" (Isaac Watts, "O God, Our Help In Ages Past").

Somehow, it's September again. September means a lot of things. It means the end of summer vacation and county fair season; children, youth, and teachers going back to school, busses on their routes again (STOP when they have their sign out, and be careful in the school zones). September means the fall asters are blooming, the trees are starting to change, and the Christmas decorations are already up in the stores. September also means that our shared three church ministry is already a year old! Back when we were younger, 365 days or so ago, we weren't entirely sure how this would all work or if it would work at all. We had lots and lots of questions: "Would this wear out the pastor?" "Would we be able to agree on worship times for holidays?" "What would happen if there was an emergency?" "Would people feel like they had enough of Pastor Moira's time and energy?

As I look back on this year, I think we can say with confidence that our shared ministry is working quite well! It has been a busy 2018-2019, but a good busy. People have been able to find me when they need me (*my cell phone is never very far away*), and I think I'm learning the routine of what happens next at Black Creek, integrating that into a routine I've known for much longer at Trinity & Cecil. I don't feel worn out, although there are days, and I'm careful to make sure I make time to recuperate. I'm loving having a church office where I can leave things to work on another day, going home to rest and renew myself. By a miracle, or at the very least a sure sign the Holy Spirit is with us, we agreed on worship times for Christmas Eve, Holy Week, and Easter without major conflict. We have had tremendous joys together, deep sorrows, and things in between. We have worked to strengthen relationships and build new ones. We have met the challenges that came our way and learned through it all to live into the call God has issued to us to be the Gospel in this time, in this place, with the skills, talents, and passions that we have been given.

So what's next for Tri-Jo-Jo? Well, first we need to come up with a snazzier acronym for our shared ministry. And then, we need to think about ways we can work together for even greater impact in our communities and around the world. Adding to the food pantry Trinity helps run, and the clothes closet at St. John's Cecil, what else can we offer to meet the needs of the world? What are the needs of our communities, and how can what we're good at (or might be good at) help us meet

What will we dream of doing that we've never done before?

I don't, and can't have, all those answers on my own. It will take all of us, every single person in our congregations and communities for us to live into what God is asking of us. We'll need to dream together, try things, fail some, succeed some, and try more things. We'll need to trust, through it all, that God is with us, guiding and loving us, encouraging and nurturing us, and rooting for us, as we work to build the kingdom of God here in our corner of the earth. What I do know is that we will do all this together. I'm in this for the long haul, in the good times and the struggles, laughing and crying, over coffee and at meetings, at parades and washing dishes, wherever it is you need me to be, I'll be there as best I'm able, and together, together we can and will be faithful, following in Jesus' footsteps, being God's hands and feet, hearts and minds, hope and love in the world.

Update from Kim

The blessing you are to others is evidence of the love you have for God! By the blessings you are to Ron and me, it is evident that you love the Lord so very much! Your prayers, thoughtfulness, and care means more to us than I can put into words.

Ron and I continue to see medical providers for our immediate medical problems. Ron had his third of three synthetic rooster comb injections in his right knee (it was the one injured in the automobile accident we were in May 24th, this year). The specialist said he won't know the next step for four weeks from his third injection, which was August 30th. We choose to look at these four weeks as time God has to heal it. That poor guy has had enough surgeries and still is suffering greatly with unresolved pain ~ thus, we seek God for His healing.

I continue to see a physical therapist for the neck and should injuries, which have been causing increased headaches, I sustained in the above mentioned accident. My headaches were much less frequent and intense since I have been on a medication, for the nerve pain stemming from the L-5/S-1 nerve root being significantly pinched by arthritis and bone. My back, leg, and foot are still in need of healing. Because we were in the car accident day three, after the first injection into the nerve root, to test whether surgery would help alleviate the major pain and loss of flexibility and strength, on August 22, I underwent another x-ray guided injection into the nerve root. OUCH! I certainly don't accomplish even half of what I was accomplishing before all this. The surgeon and I want to be as sure as possible that the surgery, which includes fusing L-5/S-1, will benefit me. He said I may lose even more flexibility with the fusion, but because of the significant amount of bone he'd need to *carve out*, I'd definitely need the fusion. SCARY.

We are so grateful to God for our sisters and brothers, of which you are many. Thank you for continuing to hold us in your prayers; **we truly need you and your faithful prayers**. As many here know first hand, it gets disheartening when trial after trial comes our way, especially when we haven't made it through others we are enduring.

There is good news! The three-month CT scan, of my upper left lobe of my lung, shows the nodule, which was incidentally found on the chest CT following the car accident, <u>has not grown!!!</u> The plan remains the same ~ a CT of chest every three months for a year and a half from May 24, 2019. There was another scare with my health, but by God's grace, it turned out to be benign! **Oh, praise the LORD!**

There is humor too! The other day, I was in Woodman's in Green Bay. That is a huge store, and my back, leg, and foot, have extreme difficulty getting through it without the use of one of the *wheelchair* carts. So, I use one when available. The one available that day indicated it was fully charged when I got on it; but, there must have been an electrical issue in it, for it would go and randomly stop. Here I found myself stalled in the middle of an isle, at the very back of the store, in which there were many shoppers trying to get their shopping done. Folks walking around me and giving me the *look*. You know, *the look*: "What is she doing just sitting in the way? How rude." So, I thought, I'll look up the store's phone number and call for help! LOL. Yep, I pulled out my cell..."What is that woman doing on her phone sitting in our way?!" Eventually, I was rescued by a supervisor, who kindly brought a replacement wheelchair cart to me. It wasn't so humorous for me then, but now remembering it, I can chuckle. You never know why someone is sitting in the way!

There is GRATITUDE...from us to God and to you for your loving care and prayers.
