"We are only really in control of two moments in our lives - here and now."

Somehow it's nearly January, the beginning of a brand new year. 2019 was full: of tremendous good, and incredible heartache; of laughter and tears; of opportunities and challenges. Maybe it's a feature of my age, but time seems to both speed up and slow down at the same time. I'm pretty sure 2019 lasted both fifteen minutes and seventy-six years at the same time. But a new year is here, and a new decade (cue all the bad jokes about 2020 vision ... you get to make three and then we'll be done, ok?). There's something beautiful, filled with tremendous hope, when the calendar is new. All the potential of the coming months lie ahead of us. We know some of what will happen - weddings, babies, graduations, parties, vacations, confirmations, and more. But a lot of what 2020 will bring is a great big unknown - a Packer's Super Bowl win & a Red Sox World Series (I'm told I'm supposed to say it that way to will it to happen), new opportunities and joy-filled challenges, new friends, renewed and strengthened relationships, opportunities to reach out to a world in need, and the heartbreak of loss, pain, and loved ones who walk on to eternal life. We have to live somewhere in the tension between all of these things, in the glorious mess of life, of things unexpected and grief-filled, and things planned and hoped for. In order to do that faithfully, and well, we have to remember that we really only ever have this very moment, the one we are breathing in right now. None of us can know what the next ten minutes will really hold, much less what tomorrow, or next August will have for us. We have to stand and rest in this moment, recognizing God's presence that has carried us to this place, is loving and caring for us in this second, and will guide us through whatever our tomorrows might bring.

I know that's a lot to ask, particularly in the world we are living in. Our world moves pretty fast. The second that Christmas is "over" the stores will have exercise equipment for all our New Year's resolutions right next to the Valentine's Day candy and gifts. There isn't a break in any of it, and before you know it we'll be doing taxes, and then it will be Easter, and then summer, and then back to school, and Thanksgiving, and then Christmas will roll around again all in the time it takes us to brew some coffee, take a breath, and blink twice. And, if that wasn't enough to make living in this moment hard, there's a lot of confusing days ahead of us as a country. Whatever your politics, these are days that demand we think about what it means to be a part of the U.S.A., who is welcome, who has worth, whose vision is the one we want to live into as a people. And it's an election year so we have ten months of non-stop political ads ahead, extra here in Wisconsin because we live in a swing state (or a battleground state some call it). Ten months of promises, boasting, name calling, and more as we consider together who we are, and who we want to be in the years ahead. (FYI, if you'd like to stop by for a chat about all this I'd love to, and we can think together about what the Gospel of Jesus asks of us in the public sphere, how it should shape our relationships with one another and our network of social care.)

So what do we do? How can we slow all that down and live in the moment? Well, we can't. We can't slow the world down, but we can slow ourselves down. We can choose how we're going to

live in our electronically connected, chaotic, fast paced world that tries to define us by what we spend, what we own, and how we look. We have to live in this world, but we can choose how we live. Last year I wrote to you about some resolutions of faith, and looking over that list today I realized they are all about choosing how to live in this world, how amidst the chaos to find time for body, mind, and spirit; to prioritize connections and love; to live as patiently and gently as we can in our fragile, hurting world. So humbly I offer you some 2020 resolutions for living in the moment, each and every one we've got.

2020 Resolutions For The Moment (in no particular order):

- ♥ Breathe - really, seriously breathe from the depths of your belly; you can't do much if you can't breathe, and breath doesn't come from our chests, but way down deep in our diaphragm that rises and falls to bring us the air we need for our brains, and hearts, and bodies to be possible;
- ♥ Drink Water - no, coffee doesn't count, and neither does SunDrop; get yourself a glass and drink some water, and then do it again; much like breathing, your body can't and won't work if you don't give it what it needs and you need water; plus you'll spend a lot of time going off to the bathroom so think of all the campaign ads you won't have to hear!;
- ♥ Get Sunlight - seriously, we're really not all that different than the plants sitting in my window, the sunlight helps regulate our emotions, helps us be our best, so soak it in when you can;
- ♥ Move - no, not your house, but your body, in whatever way you can; raise your arms, or your toes, or your eyes, or your tongue; stretch some part of you (and if your body doesn't stretch, stretch your mind, that counts!);
- ♥ Eat - good food slowly at least once a week; pause and set the table with fancy dishes, or unfold that napkin and make a placemat at work, but learn to slow down enough to really taste what you're eating because it's giving your body the energy you need to do what lies ahead;
- ♥ Pray - take your life to God, the joys and struggles, the excitement and fear, the hope and grief; take it all to God for at least a minute or two each day; put it into God's hands and trust in the God who has carried you this far (further than you probably ever thought you'd get);
- ♥ Connect - don't let this world isolate you; we are designed to need each other, to depend on one another; seriously, human beings weren't created to live alone, we are relational creatures who thrive when we are connected to others so call up a friend for coffee, go out to dinner with someone, watch sports with someone, form a knitting/reading/sewing/cribbage/something group with a couple other folks, put the dates on the calendar and make them as much a priority as anything else in your life;
- ♥ Love - passionately, fiercely, with everything you have; not the sweet sappy kind of love of TV and movies that doesn't ask anything of anyone, but the deep, hopeful, committed, messy love that wants the best for ourselves and for others; love when it would be easier to hate; love when you're tired and don't think you can go on; love when you're having your best day and when you're having your worst; love, and then when you think you're done and you've loved all you can, love some more, over and over and over again until it becomes who you are in the deepest part of your being.
