IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Effective Saturday August 1, 2020 Governor Evers has issued a mandatory mask order (aligning ourselves with 31 other states) and following the advice of the CDC and covid-19 task force.

Masks are required for everyone over 5 years of age (and recommended from ages 2-5) whenever people are indoors with people who are not members of their own family.

There are a few exceptions for medical conditions, and if doing things like leading worship or teaching and 6 feet of distance can be maintained (masks must still be worn when not speaking ... meaning I'll wear my mask when we listen to music and scripture and such).

<u>Yes</u>, this includes churches. So yes, to be in worship with us on Sunday August 2nd you MUST wear a mask.

This will apply to worship, all meetings, all ministries (food pantry & clothes closet), and all activities (weddings, funerals, fundraisers, etc.) until further notice.

From Pastor Moíra's Desk... Semper reformanda est...

It's all changing. Everything is different. Nothing is like it was before. Are we ever going to get back to normal? Chances are, sometime since mid-March you've said something like this. You've wondered about and struggled with all the changes in our lives since we started living with covid-19. What we once did without thinking ~ reaching out to offer a hug, or shake someone's hand, or sing happy birthday, or share a meal with someone ~ we hesitate, make sure we know where our masks and sanitizer are. With covid, and the movement for long-lasting social change, and political upheaval everything seems like it's been turned upside down and inside out, and we are living together into a mysterious unknown future. I know it can all be overwhelming. It certainly is for me. I pause in the middle of it all sometimes, standing in my kitchen looking for a mask, wondering exactly what I'm supposed to do next, how to be a pastor and a person in these days when everything I know, everything I'm trained for, seems to have flown out the window. But a few weeks ago, while doing the endless work of weeding my gardens, I remembered some important words from the Protestant Reformation ... semper reformanda est, the church is always reforming. Change is part of our make up as Christians, and particularly as Protestants. We are and have always been called to be people who adapt and change to meet the needs of the world we are living in. From the beginning, Jesus asked his followers to look at the needs of the world, to the people around them, and respond from the deepest roots of our faith, from the grace of God, the love of self and neighbor, and our knowledge of how deeply we are connected to each other. I don't know if the world we are living in is changing more, or faster than they have before. Technology may be making that true because it brings the change into our living rooms, and our pockets, much faster and more immediately than before. But what I do know is that we CAN handle this change and whatever the future might bring. I said at the beginning of the pandemic that we were going to draw deep on our faith and rural roots, on our connections to God and one another, to meet this challenge. And so far we have done that with grace and courage, and I know we will do the same going forward. We will adapt and change, not on a whim, but by trusting in the God who created us, by knowing that Jesus walks with us through this, and every challenge of our lives. We will draw on our reformed heritage, knowing that the church has met the challenges of its day for generations, holding fast to the truth that God's love is for everyone, absolutely everyone. And we will rely on each other, on our relationships and dependence, to be equal to all these days require of us. It won't be easy. There will be more challenges, and we will frequently feel like we don't know what we're doing, like things are changing faster than we can adapt. But when that happens we will take a few deep breaths, make some tea (or coffee, or eat a cookie or something). Then we will pray, and reach out to each other, and know that in all things we rest in the love of God that will never, ever, ever leave us. In peace and grace, Pastor Moira

In God we trust as a cocked hat may God protect us always as one nation under God with liberty, justice for all. Two readings of a "daughter missing her Marine dad" and "why go to church?" Thank God for our physical and spiritual nourishment. The word BIBLE means Basic Instruction Before Leaving Earth. Closed with a prayer.
