### From Pastor Moira's Desk...

Fall is here, kind of. The first few days have felt much more like summer, but the turning leaves, the fields being harvested, and the abundance of apples available surely mean the seasons are changing. It's a little more than a month until the election, a few weeks after that it will be Thanksgiving (and deer season), and a month after that it will be Christmas. In this year when we are learning to live with covid-19, time has become unsettled. The days and weeks pass, but they seem to merge one into another, and as I write this I've been convinced it's Wednesday all day, even though I know quite clearly because my phone, my alarm clock, my car, and assorted calendars all assure me that it's Thursday. Learning to live with the virus and keep ourselves safe, along with the social upheaval we are living through, and the challenges of a presidential election year have all unmoored us, set us a bit adrift, not quite sure what to hold on to, and wondering how to plan and look towards the future. It's quite easy in these days to give in to despair, to fear and hatred, to isolation and selfishness, thinking only of ourselves and our families, the people we already know, who agree with us, who we think are like us. Our faith, of course, asks us to live differently. We are called to trust, to be people of hope and generosity, and to reach out to everyone with the same loving kindness and compassion that God shows towards us.

As you know, we've been working our way through the stories of Exodus in worship, walking with the people of Israel through their slavery, across the sea into freedom, and now into the long wandering they will have in the wilderness. Last week (September 20th) we heard the story of God providing the people with manna, flaky bread that appeared every morning for forty years, to sustain and nourish the people for their journey. We closed worship with the hymn "Great Is Your Faithfulness" that has the line "all I have needed your hand has provided", a reminder that God will always provide for us.

But as I said in worship, it may not (and probably will not) look like we are used to. The manna the people of Israel ate didn't look like the bread they had in Egypt. The life we are living doesn't look like the one we are used to, the one we had last year, or even six months ago. Yet, through it all, God is still providing for us, giving us what we need for this life, and who we need to walk through it with us. In these uncertain times it might be a stranger who shares their good news with you, a family member lending a hand, a friend who calls just when we need to hear someone's voice, a pain and grief shared with someone who is there for us when the rest of the world seems to have walked away, an all take out fall feast, a bizarre bazaar, a soup instead of pancakes sale, and a pastor in tie-dyed high tops cheering us on through it all. The way ahead isn't clear to any of us, and I don't know when we're going to be out of the woods in dealing with covid, or when all the isms have been eradicated and true justice achieved for all God's children, but what I do know is that through it all, God will provide for us what we need (not necessarily what we want), in often unexpected ways, and that through it all we will be together on this journey wherever it shall lead us.
