# From Pastor Moíra's Desk...

The cold of winter is really here. It was barely +3° (F) when I was pumping gas this morning, a temperature that makes me wonder about the wisdom of living in a place where the weather forecasters call that the beginning of "milder" temperatures, and it's a temperature that definitely makes me count the days until baseball spring training begins. Thankfully, I suppose, this stretch of cold weather has at least come with some sunshine which has helped my mood, and many others I suppose, as life with covid continues.

According to my computer and a countdown calendar, we've been dealing with the changes covid has caused for 318 days (I'm writing this on January 28th, and we started some kind of covid related procedures on March 17, 2020). I'm tired of it, as I'm sure you are too. But at the same time, our collective health, the health of our communities and indeed the entire world, needs us to continue being as careful as we can ~ wearing masks, using hand sanitizer, practicing good distancing, avoiding large crowds, and balancing our needs with our collective risk. Sometime, as more people become vaccinated (I get my first shot on February 10th), prayerfully perhaps by mid-summer, we will be coming through this great challenge, transformed by what we have learned is truly important in our lives, and in the life of the world.

Meanwhile, we find ourselves in the church on the edge of another Lenten season. This is a time to turn our hearts, minds, and spirits towards reflecting on what God offers to us, and needs from us at this particular place in our lives, at this particular time in the life of the world. While every Lent brings with it thinking about Jesus' death and resurrection, I'm wondering if this particular Lent, after a year when so much feels like it's been taken from us, we might also think and reflect on what has been given to us. As a small child I thought that Lent was called that because God had lent us something, given something to us to borrow for a time. I'm not sure I was entirely wrong. These weeks of Lent, that will begin with Ash Wednesday on February 17th, are a gift, a gift of time given to us by God that we might deepen our faith in prayer; consider and reflect on what we believe and why we believe it; think about how our faith and beliefs affect what we do and how we do it in the world; and strengthen our understanding of God's incredible love for us, a love so fierce and tender, so strong and compassionate that it will never, ever let us go. I pray that this season ~ both winter and Lent ~ might be for us one of growth in spirit, in heart, in our capacity to love and be loved, and to become ever more the community of God's people that we were designed to be.
