


From Pastor Moira's Desk...

One Great Hour Of Sharing (OGHS)

OGHS is a special offering of the United Church of Christ. Working with international partners OGHS provides sources of clean water, food, education, and health care; micro-credit loans for small businesses;

resettlement for refugees; and emergency relief. OGHS also supports domestic and international disaster preparedness and response. Along with several other Christian denominations – American Baptist Church, Christian Church Disciples of Christ, Church of the Brethren, and Cumberland Presbyterian Church – the UCC works with Church World Service to develop common promotional materials and goals while retaining control of all their own denomination's offerings. Sixty-two percent of the UCC's offering supports international development including annual support for missionaries and others working in disaster relief, health care, education, development of sustainable agriculture, and refugee support. Nearly one-fifth of the UCC's offering is shared through Church World Service to support refugees and disaster programs around the world.

Living Lent In Our Living Rooms ~ Giving Calendar Ideas & Information

We are part way through Lent and hopefully your Living Lent In Our Living Room kit is proving helpful for you and your house during this holy season as we work on better following in Jesus' footsteps and thinking about what his ministry, death, and resurrection mean for us and for the world this year. As you know, there is a giving calendar in the Lent kit that includes a suggested item for you to donate to our area food pantries during this season. Because getting out and shopping is a challenge for some, we also included a giving envelope where you could make a monetary donation. Someone asked what it would cost if you purchased every item on the list. It was a great question and one I hadn't thought about at all. So with the help of the internet I set about finding out. If you shop for generics, and you don't buy the largest container of peanut butter available, it would be just over \$68 to purchase every item in the calendar. The first week is expensive (\$15.48) because of the peanut butter mostly), and the fourth week (\$12.03) because fruit and juice are just plain expensive, and the last week of non-food items is pricy (\$12.80), but the other weeks are in the \$6-7 range so perhaps it evens out. Whatever you're able to contribute ~ in food or money ~ will go a long way towards helping end hunger in our area. *Thank you!*
