From Pastor Moira's Desk...

It's time again for turkey, potatoes, cranberries, green beans, sweet potatoes, Brussel sprouts (maybe), and my favorite ~ stuffing. But most importantly, it's PIE season. If my body wouldn't object, I would have a bowl of stuffing and then four or five or six pieces of different kinds of pie. But, my body will be happier if I try to balance it with a nice salad, some more green beans, and small tastes of pie which is why I've started making them in cupcake pans, little two or three bite pies that allow me to have some variety without overdoing it quite as much.

There are some problems with the version of the first Thanksgiving that many (most) of us learned in school. The history of colonial expansion, and how indigenous people were, and are, treated even today is a complicated one, something that we need to face directly, honestly and openly so that together we might build a better future for all humanity, and all creation. But that is a much bigger conversation, part of the long work of true Christian faith and discipleship.

But for now, for this November, I'd like us to think about gratitude as a way of life for those of us who are working to follow Jesus. It's easy to get caught up in thinking that we are entitled to the things we have, and the lives we live. We can act as if we are owed our blessings, the comforts of our homes, friends, family, community, possessions, and more. But we aren't. All of it, all of life from our every breath to our every piece of pie, is a gift from God's incredible love and grace. This season of Thanksgiving calls our attention to doing just that ~ giving thanks for the blessings of our lives, and for the gift of life itself.

But what if we lived every day as if it were Thanksgiving? We could eat pie every day (well, maybe not), but we could surely give thanks to God for all that we have, all that we are, and all that might yet come before us. We could wake up in the morning and give thanks for our eyes opening, for the roof over our heads, for the coffee or tea we enjoy while it's getting colder outside. We could sit down at our lunch table and give thanks for the food that nourishes our bodies, the hands that helped grow and prepare it. We could take our shower, and turn up the thermostat, and put gas in the car, and take out the garbage and give thanks for all of it. And every night we could lie down again, giving thanks for all that the day held ~ the good, the hard, and the mundane ~ knowing that through it all God was and always will be with us, guiding us, nurturing us, inspiring us, encouraging us, and loving us completely.

So, my friends, let us be thank-filled people not just on the third Thursday in November, but each and every day of our lives. Let us rejoice in our many blessings and trust in God's presence.

Sabbatical Corner...

What's a sabbatical? It as an extended time for renewal and continuing education. It's a time for Pastor Moira to reconnect with herself, as a person of faith, to nourish her soul, to restore and renew the light of God within her. It is an extended sabbath, a gift of time from God, so that Pastor Moira can prevent burn-out (which is very common in ministry and other caring professions). This time will allow her to continue enjoying her ministry with us for many years to come.

So it's vacation? No. It's more like extended continuing education time where Pastor Moira works on her faith, and her ministry skills (and probably takes a few more naps).

How long is Pastor Moira's sabbatical? Pastor Moira's call with us says she gets three months every five years.

Um? What? She'll be gone for three months? No. Don't panic. Pastor Moira is going to take her sabbatical in two blocks, one for six weeks (June 25 – July 31, 2023) and one for four weeks (December 31, 2023 – January 24, 2024).

Has she done this before? Yes, twice in the time she's been with Trinity & Cecil she's had a sabbatical (during 2008-2009 & 2015-2016). Trinity & Cecil have been through this twice so Black Creek is going to lean on the wisdom and experience of our partners in ministry about this since they've never had a pastor take a sabbatical before.

What will she do while she's away? Plans are still evolving, but during the first part she'll be traveling to Indianapolis, IN for the United Church of Christ's General Synod, doing advocacy for Break The Silence Sunday. There will also be a lot of reading, particularly about the changing face of rural ministry. In the second part she's going to take a train trip to Massachusetts.

What will we do while she's away? The combined parish leadership is working on the answer to that question. We will have folks provide worship leadership during these weeks. We'll also work with area pastors to provide care for emergencies while members of the parish do regular calls and visits. Generally speaking, we also don't schedule weddings or baptisms during the sabbatical and we'll work with the area funeral homes to cover those kinds of emergencies.

In the coming months, much more information will be provided about what Pastor Moira will be doing during her sabbatical, the sabbatical worship schedule, and how we will take care of pastoral care. You'll probably have lots of questions, so please don't hesitate to reach out to Pastor Moira or a member of the Trinity Council, Cecil Consistory or Black Creek Council!
