

### *From Pastor Moira's Desk...*

Somehow it's already October. Days, weeks, and months seem to be flying by. Weren't we just having Easter and beginning the summer? Now we're in the midst of parish fundraiser season, looking towards Thanksgiving and Christmas, and before you know it, the calendar pages will turn to 2023. All of this came rushing at me yesterday while I was in Door County helping my friend celebrate her birthday. She wanted to take some pictures of the water so I was sitting on a bench in the public beachfront in Ephraim, soaking in some sun since it was relatively cool (+58°), and marvelling at the beauty of creation.

But while I was doing that my brain was also running through ALL the things: what has to be done the next day to balance having had this day off, the orders for supplies for our fundraisers, and a million questions and worries ... what time should we do that? when will I get to visit someone? what about? what if? ... Ukraine. Iran. Puerto Rico. Japan. Alaska. Oregon. Yemen. Syria. Sudan. ... folks across the world and down the street ... do I have time for a walk before a 9am appointment? how do you peel the 21 pounds of apples I just bought without losing your mind? where are we gonna get more hams? You know how it goes.

Dr. King once spoke of the "fierce urgency of now" referring to our need to act in this moment to create the future we want, but I also wonder if there isn't an urgency to the now that can help us balance the seeming chaos in our brains (just assuming here that yours sometimes goes like mine was yesterday in Ephraim), and our hearts, and our spirits. Maybe there's something to be said in really, truly, honestly, and faithfully trying to live in this moment, and only this moment. Of course we need to plan, and make arrangements for things ahead of us, but we can get caught up in all of that and miss the moment, miss the things that are happening right here, right now, the miracles in front of us, present only for a fleeting moment, gone if we're too busy focusing on what's happening a week from next Tuesday.

Truthfully, this moment is the only one we have, the only one we can live into fully and completely. This is the only hour that is ours to seize for its goodness and its glory, the only chance we have to see how the world looks in this moment, on this day, in the particular place where we find ourselves. Life comes racing at us, sometimes threatening to overwhelm us.

One of the challenges of our faith, of following in Jesus' footsteps, is to slow down, to breathe into this moment and know that God is with us, and maybe more importantly whatever tomorrow (and next Tuesday and next year) will bring, God is already there ~ leading us, guiding us, offering us that amazing grace, and loving us far more than we can ever imagine.

# Sabbatical Corner...

**What's a sabbatical?** It is an extended time for renewal and continuing education. It's a time for Pastor Moira to reconnect with herself, as a person of faith, to nourish her soul, to restore and renew the light of God within her. It is an extended sabbath, a gift of time from God, so that Pastor Moira can prevent burn-out (which is very common in ministry and other caring professions). This time will allow her to continue enjoying her ministry with us for many years to come.

**So it's vacation?** No. It's more like extended continuing education time where Pastor Moira works on her faith, and her ministry skills (and probably takes a few more naps).

**How long is Pastor Moira's sabbatical?** Pastor Moira's call with us says she gets three months every five years.

**Um? What? She'll be gone for three months?** No. Don't panic. Pastor Moira is going to take her sabbatical in two blocks, one for six weeks (June 25 – July 31, 2023) and one for four weeks (December 31, 2023 – January 24, 2024).

Has she done this before? **Yes, twice in the time she's been with Trinity & Cecil she's had a sabbatical** (during 2008-2009 & 2015-2016). Trinity & Cecil have been through this twice so Black Creek is going to lean on the wisdom and experience of our partners in ministry **about this since they've never had a pastor take a sabbatical before.**

**What will she do while she's away?** Plans are still evolving, but during the first part she'll be traveling to Indianapolis, IN for the United Church of Christ's General Synod, doing advocacy for Break The Silence Sunday. There will also be a lot of reading, particularly about the changing face of rural ministry. In the second part she's going to take a train trip to Massachusetts.

**What will we do while she's away?** The combined parish leadership is working on the answer to that question. We will have folks provide worship leadership during these weeks. We'll also work with area pastors to provide care for emergencies while members of the parish do regular calls and visits. Generally speaking, we also don't schedule weddings or baptisms during the sabbatical and we'll work with the area funeral homes to cover those kinds of emergencies.

In the coming months, much more information will be provided about what Pastor Moira will be doing during her sabbatical, the sabbatical worship schedule, and how we **will take care of pastoral care. You'll probably have lots of questions, so please don't** hesitate to reach out to Pastor Moira or a member of the Trinity Council, Cecil Consistory or Black Creek Council!

We are READY to have you help support the parish while you **buy gas, and groceries, and gifts through the church's new SCRIP program.**



Working with Raise Right (which used to be called Great Lakes Scrip) we will be able to offer you gift cards for hundreds and hundreds of local & national retailers.

**We've got gas cards, grocery store cards, hardware & home improvement stores, restaurants, coffee shops, and so much more.** Pretty much if you can think of a place you would shop, we can get you a card.

You purchase the cards through the church, receiving full face value, and then the church receives a percentage back (anywhere from 2-15% depending on the retailer). SCRIP cards are a wonderful way to give gifts, and to use for your regular **expenses. They also provide you some privacy and protection since you won't have to use your bank cards at the gas pump, or when you're traveling.**

To begin with (and to cover shipping costs) we will put in orders on the first Sunday of the month. Cards will be delivered to our coordinator (Brandi Schomisch) during that week, and distributed on the second Sunday.

**Our first order day is Sunday October 2nd!**

There will be a SCRIP order station in the gathering room where you can find all kinds of information including the LONG list of participating retailers across the country and the percentage back that the church will receive for your purchases. **You'll also find order forms, and a basket where you can place your orders at any time (they'll be picked up & secured until the first Sunday of the month).**
