I'm wondering what 2023 might be like for us if we tried to find a way embrace the interruptions, to both plan, and not plan, to have dreams and ideas about how this year will go, and to live in the glorious uncertainty of where God will lead us with all the surprises (good, challenging, and run of the mill) that might come our way; to trust in the promise of Emmanuel, that whatever tomorrow holds, God is right beside us giving us all we need to face it, together. And through it all, may we remember that we are in this together, that we are Jesus' hands, feet, heart, and soul in the world, learning and living together how best to follow in his footsteps that God's kingdom might come in its fullness.

Sabbatical Corner...

Now that we've entered the new yar, Pastor Moira's sabbatical, that extended time for renewal and continuing education, is getting closer. This time is a gift from our community to Pastor Moira so that she might reconnect to herself, and to God, to nourish her soul and spirit so that she can prevent burnout.

The dates for Pastor's sabbatical are:

June 25 – July 31, 2023 (six weeks) December 31, 2023 – January 24, 2024 (four weeks)

What will happen for worship?

Pastor Moira and our parish leadership (Cecil Consistory, Black Creek Council & Trinity Council) are working on the schedule for worship leadership while she will be away. We will be drawing on some of Pastor's resources as well as people in the area who do pulpit supply for other UCC churches. We will have details for you in the coming months.

What about if I have an emergency or need a pastor?

We're working on that too. The plan is to identify a few people in each of our parish churches who would be willing to take calls from folks in need of prayer and support. These folks wouldn't necessarily provide the care, but would know who might be able to make a phone call, stop by to visit, or provide other support. These would be for things like "planned" surgeries, "routine" illnesses, and "minor" emergencies. All those things are in quotes because it will all depend on the circumstances. Our volunteers will be given some advice and training from Pastor Moira about how to handle these things, what can be done by our own parishioners (you all already visit and care for and pray for each other after surgery and during illness so this won't really be much different). Our parish volunteers will also know how to reach local area clergy who would be willing to provide other kinds of care that might need a pastor.

Please consider if you'd be willing to be one of our parish volunteers. We probably need 2-3 people at each church, and you don't have to commit to being available the entire time (we know, some of it is summer).

If you're interested, or need more information, please talk with Pastor Moira.

Will I be able to call, text, or send messages to Pastor while she's on sabbatical? Yes, and no. Yes, of course you will. Please continue to share what's going on in your life, your joys and concerns, BUT please don't expect responses (or quick ones). This is a time for Pastor Moira to be away, to step away from the demands of the phone (and email) and maybe even turn it off, to renew herself so she can continue to enjoy being our pastor for years to come. And because it's who she is, she'll still be on social media so you'll know what she's up to.
