From Pastor Moira's Desk ...

It's February. Yesterday they pulled the innocent groundhog out of his den over in Pennsylvania and the poor creature saw his shadow which means there are six more weeks of winter. Of course, with below zero temperatures today and even colder wind chills, we already knew that here in Wisconsin. Yes, it's going to warm up next week (quite a lot actually), but we all know better than to put away the heavy coats and boots just yet.

But at the same time we are through the darkest of the winter nights. The sun is now setting after 5pm (only by a few minutes, but still that counts), and it won't set before 5pm again until November. The seeds are in the stores, and this month spring training for baseball will begin. There's still time to enjoy some winter and outdoor adventures, but we're also at the place where we can look forward to spring and summer.

This is an interesting in-between place to stand, where we can feel both seasons at the same time, and in the life of the church when we're between Christmas and Lent. These weeks of Epiphany are an in-between place too. The miracle of Emmanuel is still fresh in our hearts and minds, the wonder of Bethlehem and Christmas, of the incarnation, God becoming fully human, to know our lives and live with us. And, we can see Lent on the horizon, those weeks of waiting and praying, thinking and wondering about all that led to Jesus' arrest, trials, death, and resurrection and what it means for us this particular year.

And then there's all we're dealing with as a country. We're all overwhelmed by the news (and video if you watched it) of the death of Tyre Nichols at the hands of police officers in Memphis, and we keep his family in our prayers as their personal grief has become so very public. And we keep the entire community of Memphis, and of every place in the world, in our hearts as we work together to figure out how such tragedies happen, where does such violence come from in our personal and shared history, and how we can prevent them from happening again.

Plus, it's only February and we've already had more than 50 mass shootings. These shootings are in cities, and small towns and cross all kinds of social, ethnic, and other lines. It's like an infection running deep through our society.

Something is terribly wrong and we've got to find ways to work together to figure out what to do. It's not just a guns problem, though that is definitely part of it. There are issues of community support, social networks for physical and metal health, how we handle our anger, and so much more. Governments will only be able to do so much, so let's talk, as Jesus' disciples, about how we might do our part, in our communities, to help them be safer places for all people.

And in news of the world, the war in Ukraine slogs on, nearing the one year mark. It's been two years since the coup in Myanmar, much of Africa is suffering under a terrible famine, parts of Australia and New Zealand are dealing with record flooding, and for everyone everywhere there are rising prices, stretched budgets and tempers, and so much more.

Take a breath. Seriously, right now. Take a breath as deeply as you can, in and out, and feel the Spirit moving through you.

Yes, the news is challenging. Living in these days is full of all kinds of struggles, but there is also goodness and grace abounding. All three of our parish churches finished the year financially stable even in these challenging times. More than that, we continue to gather to worship, support each other, pray with and for one another, laugh and cry, work and play together, and truly work towards being a place of abundant welcome for all God's children.

We are places of hope where we trust in a greater truth than anything the news can tell us ~ that God is always with us. We are places of grace where we work together, across all our different understandings and ideas about the world, for a common calling ~ the abundance of God's kingdom. We are places of kindness, compassion, mercy, and peace where we can all be who we are, fully feeling our feelings, honest about our joys and struggles, knowing that we are loved beyond anything we can imagine.

May we find, in these in-between days in the church and in the life of the world, ways to be together as Jesus' disciples, to trust in the goodness of God's grace, and to know that together, with God and one another, we can meet whatever lies ahead.
