

From Pastor Moira's Desk...

It's spring in Wisconsin. You can tell because it snowed overnight, it's raining now, there's a forecast for more snow tomorrow, and it is supposed to be +50° by next weekend. The migrating birds are starting to return, some brave crocus and tulips (in south facing beds) are poking through, and the pollen sneezing has begun. Most importantly, I know it's spring because they've started playing regular season baseball, and even if I'm not happy about some of the new rules changes, I can still listen to games on the radio (my preference if I'm not at the game in person). Eventually it will really be spring and we'll get to plant things and consider annual flowers and so much more, but we have to wait.

It is also the end of another Lenten season. The beginning of April brings us the celebration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday and the following week the miracle of the empty tomb will be revealed to us again. In between, of course, things change quite a lot. The crowd that welcomed Jesus on Palm Sunday turns to shouting for his death by Holy Friday. So, much like waiting for spring, we have to wait through the days of Holy Week. Even though we know how the story will end, we have to slow down and allow ourselves to wonder how it happened, how the crowd turned against Jesus so quickly, what kind of fears led to the leaders of the people arresting Jesus, why the message of God's love and grace being for ALL was so threatening to those in power. And while we wait, we think about what the Spirit needs from us and for us this particular Easter, as the people we are who have lived through all the days since last Easter with all their joys and struggles.

And as I write this, we are still reeling from the most recent school shooting, this time at an elementary school in Nashville, Tennessee where three children and three adults were killed, along with the shooter. As someone who uses words for a living, and loves them, I'm running out of them. Nothing I saw seems to be enough, but something has to be done before more parents, children, siblings, and friends have to bury another loved one killed in this senselessness. I keep coming back to Jesus' words in Matthew's gospel. In the garden, as he's being arrested, one of the disciples lashes out with a sword, cutting off the ear of the high priest's servant. Jesus says, "put your sword back into its place; for all who take the sword will perish by the sword." (Matthew 25.52) As disciples of Jesus, we are called to be peacemakers, to speak the truth WITH love, to reach out to those who have been marginalized and excluded, to live and love and work as Jesus did during his lifetime, to remember that grace isn't just for us, but is for ALL people and ALL creation, no exceptions ever. As we wait for the miracle of the resurrection, let us be people of the good news and do SOMETHING ~ write, plan, call, organize, reach out, pray, act ~ something for the wholeness of all God's people that this epidemic might come to an end.
