From Pastor Moira's Desk ...

In worship on Sunday June 18th, we read from Matthew's gospel. Jesus is sending the disciples out to do ministry in his name. He gives them instructions about what to pack ~ no extras that would burden them with the things of this world, reminding them to trust in all God will provide, and how to behave in the different towns and villages they will visit. In particular, Jesus says, "stay there until you leave." (*Matthew 10.11*) I also mentioned a sign in my office, directly across from my desk, that reads "Be Here Now".

As I write this, it's the last few days before my sabbatical begins. The list is down to about half a page (from its height at eight pages). I've started crossing things off with a big blue marker so I know they're really crossed off and done. We're down to the last bits of paperwork, these newsletters, two funerals, a couple of visits, and cleaning my office at Black Creek. It's so easy to get caught up in the lists, in the things we should and could be doing, in the plans we have for tomorrow, next week, next year, and even further down the line. But one of the challenges of our faith is, as Jesus said, to stay here, in the present, in what is happening in this hour, this day, this moment.

Planning and dreaming about the future, setting goals and figuring out how to achieve them ~ that's all important so that our lives can be vital and meaningful. But while we're busy planning, God is revealing things to us in the present, in the now, revealing to us what God needs us to be doing for the work of the kingdom in this time, whispering to us about all the ways God is revealed to us in the miracles we often overlook while we're focused on what lies ahead.

As we enter into this sabbatical time together, I pray that we might all be here now, be present in what is happening in us, to us, through us, and around us. Watch the breeze in the trees, marvel at the growing plants in the garden, stop and breathe in the smells of midsummer in Wisconsin, count the stars, laugh with your friends, drink your iced tea slowly, focus on your heartbeat and your breath and remember that, as big as the universe is, God decided the universe needed one of YOU.

And then find ways to connect with others, to reach out and help, offer a listening ear, share some sweet corn or strawberries, go to a concert in the park with someone who might be lonely, eat some brats and burgers or indulge in an ice cream cone. However you spend these days, be here now, be present with God and with one another, and truly we will be the beloved community Jesus taught us about. And please know, while I am away, you will all be in my heart and mind.


