From Pastor Moira's Desk...

It's September. They're bringing in the hay, they're playing baseball and football and basketball too, and it's time for back to school (make sure you stop for the school busses please). And it's back to a different rhythm in the life of the church. Our worship time at Cecil changes back to 4pm, and we look towards fall fundraisers, All Saints Day, Advent, and Christmas too. For me, this August has been a bit of a blur getting back into the rhythm of things after the first part of my sabbatical, so I'm looking forward to the things ahead that will shape our weeks and months.

Speaking of sabbatical, thank you so much for the gift of this time. I know it probably felt risky, having the pastor away for that long, and I am grateful for your trust in me, and in our life and ministry together. I'm going to share a few brief reflections with you about what I did during this part of the sabbatical, and what I'll be doing in January during the next part.

General Synod for Break The Silence Sunday ~ every few years the entire UCC gets together to do our shared business and work (think of a congregational meeting multiplied by all our congregations). I attended, with my friend Lella Baker, to do the advocacy and support work of Break The Silence Sunday, to listen to survivors (more than 130 stories were shared) and to help congregations and communities learn how they can participate in this important work. It was hard, and holy, and I am so incredibly honored that survivors trust me with their experiences, and for the opportunity to open up this work throughout the denomination.

Writing ~ I'm working on a book, really a collection of stories, about ministry, and particularly about why long-term parish ministry, sticking around for more than five or six years (the average length of UCC pastorates). I'm writing about my adventures with you, with the incredible joy that comes from being part of a community, a group of folks committed to each other and to the work of following in Jesus' footsteps. Hopefully, when it's all done, it will be full of laughter, and reflection, and ideas for pastors & churches about how to do this work together with creativity and enthusiasm over the course of many, many years.

Napping ~ I also took a lot of naps, allowing each day after Synod to evolve at its own pace, cuddling kittens, knitting, watching British murder mysteries on TV, and more napping. I made some short trips within Wisconsin to visit friends, went to the farmer's market, and puttered around my house a lot.

January ~ I'll be working on the writing some more, having more naps I'm sure, and going to Boston with my friend Helen to visit Lella. We'll see the sights including the best baseball stadium in the world. A reminder that those dates are December 31, 2023 through January 24, 2024 and Student Pastor Mark will be with you in worship again.

Thank you again for the gift of sabbatical time. I pray that these days ahead will bring us all a renewed sense of the strength of our community & the work Jesus has set before us. *In peace and grace, Pastor Moira*

Sabbatical Corner...


The first part of sabbatical was a great success.
