From Pastor Moira's Desk ...

As I write this it's raining, unusual for late October, and the rain feels as heavy as my heart. News overnight was of yet another mass shooting, this time in and near Lewiston, Maine, and Israel sent tanks into Gaza yesterday and are bombing places where people are sheltering while Hamas continues to hold hostages and aid convoys aren't able to reach those in need of food, water, fuel, and medicines.

People (and the media of all sides) are forgetting that there is a difference between the government of Israel and the Jewish people, just as there is a difference between the terrorist organization Hamas and the Palestinian people. using the war to justify anti-Semitism (anti-Jewish) and anti-Muslim words and actions.

As I've said in worship the last few weeks, no hatred is ever acceptable if you are following Jesus. None, ever. None of the actions of any side of this conflict can be used as an excuse to hate anyone regardless of their faith, their ethnicity, their country, their politics, or anything else. We cannot add any more hatred to this world if we are going to claim to be Jesus' disciples.

The wars in Ukraine and Syria continue to rage, and a powerful hurricane made landfall in Mexico, causing incredible destruction in the resort town of Acapulco. Closer to home, we're all still reeling from the terrible accident on Highway 187 near Trinity that took the life of Dylan Herb and seriously injured two other young men. And all of that is before we get to things like friends who are struggling, job and bill worries, health problems, old and new grief, and so much more. It's scary, and hard, and just plain overwhelming.

And yet, November is also the season of gratitude, and soon we'll be in Advent and Christmas, the season of hope, times when we give thanks for our blessings, and when we remember that there is something at work for good in our lives and the world.

We can't watch every bit of news from everywhere around the world 24 hours a day and 7 days a week, but we also can't climb into bed and pull the covers over our heads and ignore everything. So what do we do? How are we supposed to be faithful when it all feels just so incredibly overwhelming?

First, I think, we allow ourselves to feel our feelings ~ anger, fear, frustration, worry, grief, and all the other stuff we feel about our lives, and the life of the world. Don't try to stuff your feelings away, or pretend they don't exist. Don't try to be "fine" when you

aren't. Be as honest with yourselves and with others as you can about what and how you're feeling. Try to name the feelings—grief and anger can feel a lot alike in our minds and bodies. Not everyone needs to know the details of what you're feeling, but make sure there's someone (hint, your Pastor is here for this) you can open up to, and share what's really going on in your heart, mind, and spirit.

Second, be careful with your news consumption. Choose your sources well, looking for balanced reporting as best you can. Remember that in the first hours (sometimes) days of an event like the accident near Trinity or the shootings in Maine, information will be contradictory and confusing. And remember, you're not responsible for watching every minute of every hour of coverage. Turn off the TV, the computer, and the instant alerts on your phone. Don't pick up the paper until maybe after lunch. Find a couple of friends and share the work of staying on top of what's going on, each of you taking a turn for a day or two. Watch the 6pm news and then leave it be until morning and you've had your rest. Change the channel to something like re-runs of Bonanza or a cooking show.

Third, look for the glimmers of good. They're out there, everywhere, but we all get bogged down with the pain and hurt of the world that we can't see them. In the middle of today's rain and chaos I have a bag on my desk with six homegrown Cortland apples (because if it was more than six I'd eat them until I got sick because I love them so much). Those apples aren't going to solve any problems, not really, but they will remind me that we are connected each of us to every other one, and that there is so much more love in the world than we sometimes think. So look for little bits of hope. It's not naïve to do so, but is the deepest work of our faith. Look for a break in the clouds, a friendly gesture, a kind moment, a pause in the chaos, the helpers, the lovers, the dreamers who all know there is something beyond the pain and heartbreak of the news. And remember sometimes the glimmers are really tiny ~ you didn't spill your tea on your shirt, and you made it through this day and you never have to do it again.

In all things, please remember we really are in this together. I don't know what tomorrow holds, but I know that God is already there, leading and guiding us, and I know that wherever we're going, we go together. Please, reach out (email, text, phone, office visit, coffee shop, whatever works). Let's talk and work through this life together ~ the big stuff and the small stuff which is really much bigger than we think. It really is my deepest honor to be your pastor, with you in all that this life brings.

Come if you like carrot cake, sugar cookies, and cocoa.


