#### From Pastor Moira's Desk...

I've been thinking a lot about hope lately. You've probably noticed that there's a LOT going on in the world. War continues to slog on in Ukraine, Haiti is a mess with gangs in control of much of the capitol, Sudan and Ethiopia are struggling, and that's before we come to Palestine and Israel where we desperately need an unconditional ceasefire, and here at home where we're dealing with more gun violence and the long slog through this year's presidential election cycle. And that's before we get to things closer to home, our personal, and family, and community concerns. All of it can be overwhelming, and it can be tempting to give in to despair, to pull the covers over our heads, lock the doors, and give up on hope entirely.

The world around us would definitely support the idea of giving up on hope. We're told that hope is silly, or naïve, or foolish. Hope is something little kids or people who aren't paying attention have. It's not for serious grown-ups who understand how the world works. Cynicism, bitterness, and despair ~ that's how mature adults are supposed to live.

But ... but we are people whose lives are formed and guided by a story that is stronger than even the powers of violence and death. We are shaped by the birth, life, ministry, death, and resurrection of Jesus. The gospel, Jesus' biography, is a story about a hope rooted in the deepest truth of our faith, that Emmanuel is true, that God is with us, always has been, is now, and always will be. Our lives are rooted in a God who knows what our lives are like, who faced the challenges of being human, who met all those challenges with love and grace, and who showed us that life and love will always have the final word.

Our hope is anything but naïve or foolish. It's a messy hope that sees the pain and heartbreak, the injustice and cruelty of the world and refuses to give in. It sees all those things and works to end them with words, and actions, and prayers. It offers love and patience and kindness, a moment to pause in the middle of the chaos, a quiet word instead of screaming, an open hand and heart instead of a clenched fist. Our hope trusts in things we cannot see; in the truth that after winter, spring will always come; in remembering we are deeply connected and dependent on God and one another; in acknowledging the strength we gain from all our glorious diversity; in remembering that it is God's place, and God's alone, to judge and that our work comes in offering love, and more love, and even more love.

As we journey through Lent and gather to celebrate the good news of the empty tomb at the end of the month, I pray we might dig deep into our faith, into the life of Jesus, and hold on to hope, to that maybe small and fragile seed of hope, knowing that it can grow and blossom into the biggest flower or the mightiest tree because our hope comes from the One who knows us, calls us each by name, the One who came to love us into life, and the One whom not even the power of death could take from us. May that hope fill us, encourage us, inspire us, unsettle us, comfort us, nurture us, and lead us in all we do that we might share the good news of God's love with our words, our actions, and our very beings.




