From Pastor Moira's Desk...

It's spring in Wisconsin. I know this because the tulips are poking through the snow, and we're back to wearing our winter coats while the orange barrels have come out for road construction just about everywhere, they're playing baseball and the kids are starting to run track at school. Spring is one of those seasons in our lives that seems to come and go, teasing us with warm temperatures, encouraging us to put away the gloves and hats, and then sending the cold back and sending us scrambling as we find our scarves again. It's been like that for every spring I've lived in Wisconsin so it's no great surprise that we've had snow, and rain, and so much wind since the official meteorological beginning of the season. But, we're also now into the season of Easter, or at least we will be by the time you read this after we move through the last days of this week (I'm writing on Thursday), and after our incredible parish celebrations of the resurrection on Sunday. Unlike Spring, Easter comes and doesn't leave. Just like the promise at Christmas of *Emmanuel*, God always with us, Easter comes and reassures us that whatever life brings, whatever challenges we face and joys we celebrate, the tomb is empty, Christ is risen, and life and love will always have the final word.

That's the great good news of our faith, even in the middle of these complicated days in our lives and in the life of the world. While we continue to call for unconditional cease fire in Palestine and Ukraine, we know war and violence continue in Haiti, Sudan, Syria, and so many other places. We are all stunned by the Holy Week collapse of the Francis Scott Key bridge in Baltimore and we pray for the families of those whose lives were lost while we give thanks for the rescue workers and those who worked to save lives. And we're in the middle of the long slog towards November and the presidential (and in Wisconsin US senate) election with all its bitterness and fighting from every side. But still, even now, even with all those challenges and the things we face closer to home as individuals, and families, and local communities, even now the power of life is at work in us and through us. We are people of the resurrection, not just on Easter Sunday, but in all our lives as Jesus' people. Death, despair, violence, and hopelessness will not, will never have the final word. In the beautiful chaos of our lives we will always be people who say "Christ is Risen!" not just with our words, but with our every deed, our every action, our every prayer, our every breath. For that, for YOU, and for the amazing strength and creativity of our parish, even in the midst of the yo-yo spring of the world, I give thanks.
