

### News From The Church Garden... The Garden of Eatin

We are all planted for our second season of providing produce to our food pantries. We're growing bush beans again (you remember how abundantly they produced last year!), but we've added pole beans, and cucumbers (which



we're going to train to grow up poles), and bell peppers. We've moved the tomato beds to the sunniest spot in the garden since they didn't produce as well as we hoped last year, and we replaced the beds they were in with more of the steel framed ones that did so well for the beans. We're trying three different kinds of tomatoes ~ champion, sweet 100s (red cherry), and yellow cherry. One set of our strawberry plants did very well over the winter so we're hopeful that we'll have at least a few berries to enjoy later this year as a sweet treat for our workers. Our fall bulb planting went wonderfully well and brought color and life to the garden in the still cold days of early spring. Now we've planted some perennials to attract pollinators and bring color and beauty through the rest of the year. We've got a cone flower (echinacea) and hyssop growing by the green house (with some annual cosmos in between just for pretty). Up at the front we've got two false sunflowers (heliopsis) and a butterfly weed. We also planted another row of real sunflowers along the west fence line and we're wondering if these will pay attention to what their seed packet said. Last year the ones we planted said they wouldn't be more than 3 feet tall and they ended up near 7 or 8 feet. And the hollyhocks we planted last year came back which is excellent. We also moved the tool shed from the side of the church building because it was too attractive & warm for the wasps, and added our fake wasps nests to hopefully deter them from setting up residence. Plus, we have a table and two chairs (in addition to our benches), nicely located in the part of the garden that is well shaded. You're invited to come out and sit a spell, absorbing some of the beauty of God's creation. We also have a plan to create a rock border near the bulb planting to help keep the mulch under control.

Look for the watering sign-up sheet in the gathering room and help us grow another year of bounty & abundance.
