From Pastor Moira's Desk,...

Water seems to be the story of this summer. There's time at the lake, and in the swimming pool, and floating down the river, but it's a different kind of water I'm thinking of. Rain, and more rain, and then a tornado for variety (rather too close to my house for my taste), and then more rain. There's water everywhere, standing in fields and parking lots, providing lovely breeding ground for mosquitoes, and causing incredible headaches for farmers. In some places the corn is doing well, planted and rooted before the downpours came, and in other places, the fields are likely to be a washout, the tender seedlings unable to withstand so much. In Ruidoso (a town in southern New Mexico), there isn't enough water, fires forcing evacuations, burning through town, destroying homes and lives while wildfires rage in many other places including western Canada. A drought and heat wave have brought crippling temperatures of more than 130° F to parts of India and southern Asia, Mexico City is facing unprecedented water rationing, and the collision of war, drought, and famine are threatening the Darfur region of Sudan while my friends in Haiti are struggling to have enough water to drink, eat, and keep clean.

Water is something a lot of us take for granted. We turn on our taps and clean drinking water comes pouring out. We wash our clothes, and cars, and don't give a lot of thought to where or how we got the water. But even here in the US, it's not that way for many. Old pipes, many filled with lead, are a public health threat, and as we've learned with road construction projects, when the water lines get hit by diggers, it takes quite a while to get services restored.

I wonder what Jesus, who described himself as living water to the Samaritan woman at the well (John 7.37-39) would do with all our water related struggles this year. I don't have an answer, but I wonder if some attentiveness and attention to water might be an important first step. Unfortunately we can't load up an airplane here in Wisconsin with our excess rain and fly it down to New Mexico to put out fires, but we could send funds for drinking water to the firefighters and folks working to help those most affected; and we could investigate climate change and how it affects rising sea levels, and what could be done to conserve this precious resource before we too face water rationing, and how we mobilize to get water to people in need in places like Haiti and Michigan and so many other places. And more than anything we could be attentive to the water we use so freely, thinking about the life-giving power it brings us when we turn on our taps, when we reach for that bottle of water on a hot day, and when we turn on the hose to wash our car. I pray we might all be aware of the water we depend on that comes from our taps, and the spiritual water that comes so freely and abundantly to remind us of God's grace and love.


