There was an opinion piece in the New York Times recently titled "Joy Is Not A Strategy". The author, Patrick Healy, was talking about campaign themes during this election year, about how inviting people to joy isn't a good (winning) political approach.

But it got me to thinking about our lives as Jesus' disciples, what slogans we might use, what strategies we could best employ in order to be more faithful to the path Jesus walked.

I wonder if joy, and it's companion hope, might not just be the slogans, the strategies we need most in these days.

Whether or not these are the most difficult times in history I'm not sure, but they are our times, the ones we are living in, and they are indeed full of all kinds of things that challenge us as individuals and communities. You know the list ~ wars, violence, political and social division, climate change, heat, drought, fires, floods, storms, inflation, job losses, health problems, money worries, relationship problems, and so much more.

There is simply A LOT that we are dealing with, and sometimes it feels like the only logical choice would be to give in to despair, to believe that there's nothing we can do about any of it so we should just go back to bed, pull the covers over our heads, ignore it all, and wait for the end of days. BUT, we are people deeply rooted in the promise of Emmanuel, that God knows what our lives are like, that God is with us always.

Whatever we face ~ ups and downs and in-betweens ~ Jesus is with us through the Spirit's presence and through the presence of our communities of faith, guiding and leading us, nurturing and guiding us, holding us up when we can't hold ourselves, and celebrating with us in the goodness of life.

That presence inspires in us the deepest joy and hope we could ever imagine, something this world cannot provide, and can never take away.

The joy isn't simple happiness, but a knowledge that even when the hard times come (because surely they come into all lives), even in the depths of the worst we face, then there is a spark of life leading us. The hope isn't naïve, it looks at the challenges and problems of the world and our lives and believes that we have what we need to face them, to do more than simply endure, to recognize that yes it is a lot of work sometimes, but we have what we need ~ creativity, love, and community ~ to make a better world.

We know all this because once there was a tomb sealed with a great and mighty stone that seemed to shut away all hope, all joy, all possibilities of the future, and yet three days later, the stone had been rolled away, the tomb was empty and Christ was risen.

As we go through these days I invite you to join me on Team Hope & Team Joy. We are a team that is real and honest about the situations and struggles we are facing, and a team that knows whatever the future holds we go with God and with each other. We are a team rooted in the promise of the Gospel, the promise of Emmanuel, the promise of an empty tomb that reminds us every day that in the face of death, destruction, and division, LOVE will always be stronger, will always have the last word.
