## From Pastor Moira's Desk...

I have some delicious Cortland apples from the Oneida orchard that I've been munching on recently, there has been a bit of a crispness in the air, and the leaves are surely starting to turn from green to golds and reds and more. I still miss the sights, sounds, and smells of fall in my childhood in Albuquerque ~ the whoosh of propane filling the hot air ballons, the glorious colors of early mornings as hundreds and thousands of balloons fill the sky, some Dixon's apples (a place where the university's agriculture department worked to grow apples that tolerated desert conditions including a champagne delicious), and the smell in every grocery store parking lot of roasting green chiles.

But recently I was talking to someone who said that when they got to heaven the first thing they were going to ask God was about the color green ~ why are there so many shades of green when there really wouldn't have to be? And it made me appreciate all over again the particular beauty that is our part of northeast Wisconsin. In the desert there are a few shades of green, most of them variations of sage, but here there are hundreds. And the fall treats us to a riot of colors as the fields are plowed revealing the rich, dark earth below, the pumpkins come out along with hunting gear splashing oranges everywhere, the evergreens stay just that, green, while the other trees treat us to leaves of fire that are extra gorgeous when they catch the early morning sun, or the last rays of sunset.

And that got me to thinking about being attentive, paying attention to our lives and the world around us. These days, attentiveness can be exhausting. There is SO MUCH ~ need and heartbreak, war and disaster, the presidential election which seems like it's been going on for forty years and might never end, more wars, floods that rival the story of Noah, earthquakes, friends with health concerns, worries about our own health, jobs, finances, and more, then more wars, and well, you know what I mean. It's a lot and paying attention to it all can become too much for our hearts & souls. As I've said for a while now, it really is ok to take a break from the endlessness of news and media coverage about all these things, to let the world keep spinning even if you aren't pushing it.

And that leads us to a different kind of paying attention ~ to the moving of our hearts and souls, and the world around us. I spent a happy ten or fifteen minutes on a recent day watching the bees & butterflies that were filling the last remnants of flowers in my summer garden. They were all so busy on gathering pollen and nectar that they simply flitted around me as I marveled at their colors and variation. I pulled over while driving on highway 47 to watch a field, freshly harvested of soybeans, that was simply covered with a couple hundred seagulls gleaning the last of the beans, and harvesting the aphids and beetles too. It was staggering to see so many in flight at the same time. I'm trying to pay

attention to the colors of the sunrise and the sunset as the season changes, and to how many shades of green there are even as the orange and red come to the trees. I'm trying to listen to my heart, my soul, and my body, what they need in this season of my life, our life together as Jesus' disciples, and this moment in the life of the world. I pray that this might be a season of paying attention for all of us, to the beauty of the world in the middle of all the challenges, a reminder always of God's presence that will never leave us.
