#### From Pastor Moira's Desk...

I seem to say this rather often lately, but there is A LOT going on in the world. As I write this, it's the last few days before the presidential election, a campaign that feels like it's been going on for a decade. It's fall, and the leaves are changed, but we've had some really warm weather. They're still playing baseball, but we've also got football, basketball, rugby, and all the college sports going on too. The aggression of Israel's war against Palestine has spread to Lebanon and Iran raising fears of the possibility of so much more violence. Ukraine, Syria, Sudan, Haiti, and other places continue to deal with their ongoing wars and violence. Friends are struggling with their health, and work stuff, and relationship stuff, and all kinds of life stuff.

There was a day last week when it was a few more things than I felt like I could handle—the internet at home was out, the dishwasher wasn't working, the cats were being naughty, there was road construction again in Black Creek, and I had an early call from someone needing help from our clothes closet who was most insistent that I should drop everything to help them, and all this before 10am.

As I sat in my office a little later in the day I remembered a lesson from my preschool days at Congregational Preschool (housed in the church I grew up at). It was Thanksgiving time and we did what lots of little kids do, we made turkeys out of our handprints. But for every feather on the turkey, one for each of our fingers, (and for the turkey's head too) we had to tell our teacher something we were grateful for so they could carefully print those things all around our turkey. Then after, sitting around on the rug, we each showed our pictures and our teachers helped us share our gratitudes, counting them off on our fingers.

So on that overwhelming day last week, sitting at my desk, I held up my hand and searched my heart and mind for five things to be grateful for. I silenced my phone, closed the computer, and tried to slow down my breathing, to focus on that moment, on that very second and what it was I was truly grateful for. In the end, it wasn't all that hard to figure out five things I was grateful for, even in the middle of the chaos of that day.

The gratitude practice didn't make the chaos go away, but it gave me some perspective, that even while things are raging around us, and sometimes within us, there is a way to be grateful, and thankful. As we live into whatever the next season in our lives, and the life of our country, and the life of our world will bring us, I invite you to slow down, and think, really consider what it is you're grateful for, what blessings you have in this very moment, that we might all live from the place of that gratitude, sharing its hope with all we meet.
