From Pastor Moira's Desk,...

I'm writing this while watching a storm move over the Sandia Mountains in Albuquerque, bringing a gusty wind and a welcome cooling in the air. I've been here since the middle of last week, helping my father through the first days of grief, and all that it requires with memorial services and more, after his wife Judith passed away. Thank you all for your understanding, love, and support as I made this emergency trip, and a special thank you to everyone who helped lead worship while I was away at the weekend. It means more than I can really say.

As it's July, I'm thinking about independence. That's what all the parades, and cookouts, and fireworks will be celebrating at the end of the week, the separation of the colonies from English rule, the first steps towards what would eventually be the United States. In those early days there was a lot of debate about what independence would mean. None of the colonies could survive as a country on their own, and the nation's founders knew that. They wanted independence, but they knew it would also require relationships with one another, connections, and community. Independence from England could come, but it would also require a new dependence on one another as they formed this "more perfect union".

And, of course, for those of us who put our faith in Jesus, independence isn't part of our vocabulary. Our faith is one of community and relationship. We are made for interdependence, relying on one another. We were created by God to be connected. We are made to share our joys and struggles, the things that make our heart soar and the things that make our hearts ache, We do that, not because we think that we can "fix" them by sharing them, but because we know that a shared burden is lighter, and a shared joy is multiplied.

So what does that mean in these particular days we are living in? How do we embrace the dependence of our faith while everything around us is urging us to be more independent, to fight for "our" piece of the pie, to protect "our" own? I think it means that we remember ~ in every decision we make, in every interaction we have, with every vote we cast, with every policy issue we lobby for (or against), in every part of every aspect of our lives ~ we remember we do not exist for ourselves (or our families) alone, we exist together, united and connected, one people whatever our differences might seem to be, on one planet. So while you have your cookout, and enjoy the fireworks (though remember, not everyone does), remember that in faith we are called to work to build relationships, increase connections, and nurture our dependence on God and on one another.

Garden of Eatin News ... Things are growing & sprouting and the garden looks wonderful. We've planted beans (2 kinds), bell peppers (a favorite at the food pantry last year), cucumbers, and four kinds of tomatoes. Plus, we've planted some radishes and carrots as an experiment in a bed where the strawberry plants didn't make it through the winter.



Speaking of strawberries, though ... we've finally got lots, or at least lots more than the three we picked last year. They've escaped their bed and are taking over the fence line, producing beautiful sweet berries. We also have some critters (chipmunks we think) who are feasting on the berries, but we think that's ok if they eat the berries and leave the rest of our crops alone. We also have a new year-round bench in the garden, made from recycled plastics and plastic bags, plus our perennials are growing and beginning to bloom. Our sunflowers might or might not make it this year. They don't seem to have sprouted very well, but maybe they just need a little extra time. The greenhouse panel that blew off in the wind storms has been repaired, and soon we're counting days to harvest season. Stop out and visit the garden as there are lots of nice places to sit,
